## Moving Forward in 2007-2008

I hope this edition of the *View from the Hill* finds you enjoying our wonderful Buffalo summer and ready for our even more spectacular Buffalo fall. For those who think City Honors is ready to rest on its laurels this fall---think again! Our upcoming school year will prove once again that the administration, faculty, students, parents, and alumni of CHS are never content with the status quo and will continue to set the pace in challenging our students in academics and leadership development. The following provides just a sampling of the exciting developments for the upcoming school year:

- Mandarin Chinese language makes its debut at CHS! Starting in September, CHS will offer a full track Mandarin program starting in grade 8. Students in grades 5 and 6 will receive introductory level instruction two letter-days every cycle as a part of our International Baccalaureate Middle Years Program. Students at the high-school level who have room in their schedules may take an introductory level elective in Mandarin language and culture. Please welcome Mrs. Shue Zheng (pronounced "jung") to the Hilltop, who joins our faculty to teach Mandarin. Letters will be sent home to students in grades 8, 11, and 12 with remittance forms to indicate interest in enrollment. As an IB school, we could no longer ignore the fact that Mandarin is the most spoken language on the planet. Developing students who can speak this language offers our city a number of economic and social benefits for future generations. Mandarin Chinese joins Latin, which was added to CHS this past year. Thank you to Superintendent Dr. James Williams for his advocacy of this program.
- AP Psychology also makes its debut at CHS! With some efficient and creative work by our scheduling team, high-school students who have room in their schedule will now be able to take a full year AP Psychology course. Through course registra-

tions and meetings with the student leadership, we found that many students had expressed an interest in this subject. The course is sure to be a success under the leadership of Mr. William Cochrane, who has a great passion for this subject area. Thank you to BPS Executive Director of Special Initiatives Amber Dixon and Director of Social Studies W. Charles Brandy for their support of creating this challenging and engaging elective for our students.

- Plans for Phase III Joint School Reconstruction at CHS continue to move forward. The architects have been meeting regularly with the faculty and administration as a part of the design process. The PTSCO and CHS/FMP Foundation leadership teams are regularly apprised of progress. I also present monthly updates at PTSCO general meetings. We are scheduled to leave the Fostick-- Masten Park site in June 2008, returning to our building once construction is complete in June of 2010. After exhaustive reviews of various vacant school buildings with the BPS Division of Plant services, we have tentatively identified School #56 as the swing site for students in grade 5-8 and School #8 as the swing school for students in grades 9-12. Although it will not be ideal for the student body to be divided during reconstruction, it needs to be understood that no school buildings large enough to hold our entire school population were available. As I have told our students, we will need to roll up our sleeves and make the best of this situation. The sacrifices we make during these two years will benefit our students and the City of Buffalo for many years to come. I have been very pleased with the positive and amazingly mature reaction from our student body in its willingness to sacrifice for future generations. I realize there are bound to be many questions regarding this project. We are working to see that all details

## BPS Policy on Cell Phones, Pagers, & Two-Way Radios

1. Students are discouraged from carrying cell phones and pagers to and from school.
2. Two-way radios (FCC licensed or unlicensed) are not permitted in any BPS school or at school functions, except as authorized by the superintendent.
3. Students carrying cell phones and pagers, upon entering the school, must store these items in their lockers. The items must also be stored in the "Off" or nonoperational mode.
4. The district shall not be held responsible for lost, broken, or stolen cell phones and/or pagers.
5. During school hours, students may not carry about or operate cell phones or pagers in school buildings.
6. Any student who violates this procedure by carrying or operating a pager or cell phone in a school building will be subject to disciplinary action, and that item shall be confiscated by school personnel.
7. The violation of this school procedure will lead to the following consequences:
  - Item confiscated for 10 calendar days at the building. Parent/guardian must meet with building administrator to recover the item.
  - For a second offense, the item will be confiscated for a period of no less than 30 calendar days and held at the District Safety-Security Office.

of this massive undertaking are resolved and will plan additional communications and opportunities for community inquiry during the upcoming school year.

- The CHS/FMP Foundation is in the process of completing a new partnership with the City Honors Alumni Association and the Fosdick-Masten Park Alumni Association that will see a consolidation of fund-raising and communication efforts. The Foundation has hired a part-time development officer for the first time ever to assist with these efforts. The Foundation leadership team and I continue to pursue another large capital project to improve our school's campus and neighborhood.
- Despite sadness over the retirement of ins Gary Witek, CHS looks forward to the many new faces on the faculty and staff for the 2007-2008 school year. We anticipate this group of new faculty will bring new perspectives and energy to compliment our existing faculty. Stakeholder committees composed of faculty, parents, and administration have been meeting with candidates throughout the summer. A full listing of new faculty and staff will be a part of our back to school letter in August.
- Our third annual Speaker Series roster is being prepared and will be released to students and parents in September. The speakers and format of this series have proven to be tremendously popular among our students and we look forward to another school year of dynamic presenters.
- Despite all of the excitement surrounding these developments, let me take a moment to make families aware of some of the basics regarding the upcoming school year:
- The first day of students at all grade levels is Wednesday, September 5.
- The PTSCO Welcome Back Picnic is Friday, September 28.
- Students will receive schedules the first day of school. If

students or parents recognize an error in scheduling, there is a simple form available in the main office that can be submitted. A counselor will call a meeting as soon as possible. Students/parents should not contact the counselors directly as interruptions will slow the process. Schedule reviews are conducted by seniority.

- Please remember that the size of our middle school and high school programs and the scheduling involved do not allow for "teacher shopping" or changes in course requests. Schedule changes are made only when errors are recognized in courses needed to graduate or fulfill a program requirement. As is emphasized heavily in March, course requests are only able to be changed during the month-long window in the spring when families and students are asked to carefully select courses for the following school year.
- Please continue to support your child's summer reading efforts. Summer reading is an important tool in insuring your child's development continues during the summer months. Completion and understanding of summer reading will be assessed by your child's English Language Assessment teacher in September and included as a part of their first marking period grade.

And finally, along the lines of moving forward--- congratulations goes out to the CHS Cheerleading Team, which has broken new ground in excellence.
