Once he has received your Registration Form, Payment, *and a <u>Passport-style Photograph</u>*, he'll prepare your pass, ready for pick-up at KB for our first outing. On the way, there's a second pickup & drop-off at <u>Home Depot on Ridge Road</u>, in West Seneca (12:30 and 5:30).
