

Cardinal Craze Week Hallway Decorating Information and Rules



Please Read Carefully!!!!!

- PE and Health Classes at each grade level will visit their class hallway on 11/14 and 11/15 to decorate.
- This system was devised to disperse the amount of students who will be in hallways over the course of the week and ensure they have adult supervision. Students should keep their voice levels low as classes are taking place around them. Groups that are too loud will be asked to return to their classrooms.
- No students under any circumstances, at any time, should be decorating hallways without an adult supervisor. If you are decorating before or after school hours, you must have an adult supervising you.
- Class hallway locations have been labeled and all teachers were sent a map identifying the class hallways.
- Each class has selected an official theme to decorate around. These themes can be found on page 2 of this document. Part of the judging criteria will be how well your class has implemented your theme.
- Judging by a faculty panel will take place on Thursday after school. On Friday, all grades should clean their hallways. The faculty panel will return after school on Friday to judge cleanup. **Remember, there are as many points awarded for clean-up as there are decorating** so be sure you do a good job on clean-up and follow the rules below for both decorating and clean-up.

Do's and Don'ts of CHS Hallway Decorating

classes that do not adhere to these rules will reductions in their scoring or be disqualified

DON'T

- Use balloons. We learned the hard way that balloons do not last through the week and inevitably pop and can be jarring for certain staff and students because they rekindle traumatic experiences or can be mistaken for other sounds. Plus, balloons are not friendly to the environment. Please no balloons!

- Use any tape except painter's tape. Supplies available in the main office.
- Use ladders
- Decorate fire extinguishers, doors, fire light strobes, or cover/decorate exit signs
- Cover glass on emergency doors
- Use any permanent paint or glue
- Use decorations that will move and set off the security motion detectors at night.

- Paint any windows except in the skybridges. Window paint in the skybridges **must** be designed for use on windows and designed to be temporary. Do not cover large areas with this window paint. Remember, you must clean up whatever you put up!

-Tear displays and tape off the wall when removing decorations. Even painter's tape will pull paint off the wall if torn off quickly.

-Cover large surface areas with painter's tape.

-Touch the decorations of other classes. Students caught on camera doing this will see their classes' point total significantly reduced and may face disciplinary consequences. Be a nice human being!

DO

- -Use your class color and theme (see page 2) when decorating
- -Design displays that are creative, positive and appropriate to a school environment.
- -Create displays that show pride in your class and pride in CHS!
- -Be respectful of the decorating of other classes.
- -Clean up after yourselves while decorating
- -Keep your voices low when decorating.
