# **2011 All-WNY Academic Team Honors City Honors Seniors**

Two seniors from City Honors School have been named to *Business First*'s 2011 All-Western New York Academic Team.

Nikolas Albarran (Special Mention) and Sarah Miller (Special Mention) have qualified for this year's list of the 100 most outstanding high school seniors in the eight-county region.

Winners were chosen for their records of academic excellence, school leadership and community involvement. The top 25 were named to the First Team, 25 runners-up to the Second Team, and another 50 to the Special Mention list.

"This is a truly impressive honor," said Jack Connors, president and publisher of *Business First*. "The Academic Team is an extraordinarily exclusive group. There are roughly 20,000 seniors in Western New York's high schools, and only 100 have met the stringent standards to make this year's Academic Team. That's the

top one-half of one percent, the best and brightest students we have."

Schools throughout the eight-county region were asked to nominate their smartest and most accomplished students for consideration by a 10-member committee, which included eight admissions directors at area colleges and two *Business First* editors. A total of 113 schools responded with 410 nominees. (Each school was limited to four candidates.)

The complete list of 100 honorees – along with their photos and profiles – will be published in *Business First's 2011-2012 Guide to Western New York Schools*, which will hit newsstands on June 10.

## 2011-2012 Course Selection

Counselors held classroom guidance meetings with all 8th, 9th, 10th, and 11th grade students to gather their course selections for the 2011-2012 school year. A copy of the course request form was sent home for parental review and signature. Parents are encouraged to discuss the Course Request Form with their child, make adjustments if necessary, and return the form to their school counselor by March 30th. Please contact your child's school counselor if you have any questions or would like to schedule an appointment. Staffing and classes are determined by course requests; therefore, students are committed to the classes they select on the Course Request Forms.

During classroom guidance meetings the college application process was discussed with each grade level. Extracurricular involvement and community service was also discussed and encouraged.

**Grades 9-11** are expected to attend all classes when not in exams. These students are not allowed to leave the building unless picked up and personally signed out by a parent/guardian. Students are strongly advised to attend all classes in preparation for June examinations.

**Grade 12 students** are also expected to attend all classes. These students are not allowed to leave the building unless a parent note with a phone number is given to a homeroom teacher or brought into the office first thing in the morning. The school must be able to contact a parent by phone to confirm the release.

Students will be given a 15-minute break after an exam ends, and then they must report to their regularly scheduled class.

Conference (SC) Days If needed, families should
make alternate transportation arrangements. As part of
our magnet school graduation requirements students
must participate in examinations they are registered for,
regardless of whether they fall on ER or SC days.

- Yellow bus drop-off/pick-up is now on Masten Avenue.
- NFTA end-of-school-day Specials will continue to line up on North Street.
- The parking lot on North Street now has one entrance/exit and one direction through the lot. The entrance to the lot is on North Street.
- The main parking lot is not for student drop-off or pick-up. There is no entry, except for handicapped visitor, faculty, and staff parking from 6:00 AM to 3:00 PM on school days.
- Handicapped visitor parking and an access ramp are in the main parking lot.
- Visitors should enter through the main entrance on Fosdick Street where an attendant will screen and buzz in visitors. Please do not ask people inside the building to open other entrances because this practice compromises the safety of our students.
- Middle school parents must enter the building to sign students out in the auditorium if they are picking them up at the end of the day.
   Students in Grades 9 – 12 being picked up at dismissal should wait in the main entrance vestibule until their parent arrives on Fosdick Street to pick them up.
- Please continue to drive cautiously and carefully around our school building.


